THE COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

All baptized persons, including children, are invited to the altar rail for Communion. It is customary to receive both elements of bread and wine, but you may also choose to receive only one, or neither. To indicate that you do not wish to receive an element, cross your arms over your chest when approached by the priest or other communion minister. To receive the bread, hold out your hands with your palms open upward. To receive the wine, help guide the cup to your lips or allow the minister to intinct the wafer and place it on your tongue.
